- ❖ Each paper should have a cover page bearing details of author(s) such as names, addresses, emails and GSM number(s) with surnames written in capital letters.
- ❖ The corresponding author should be clearly indicated for papers with more than one author. The number of authors accepted per paper is not more than three.
- ❖ There should be an abstract not exceeding 250 words, an introduction, main body and conclusion, depending on the type of subject covered or disciplinary orientation of the paper.
- ❖ All tables, figures, graphs, diagrams and photographs etc. should be numbered and integrated appropriately.
